1. Apologies for Absence

- 2. Councillors voted to accept the apologies.

2. Declarations of Interest

There were no declarations of interest.

3. Dispensation

4. Minutes

All Councillors confirmed receipt of the minutes from the meetings of the 9th January 2025. Cllr Johnson proposed to accept the minutes of the meeting of the 9th January 2025 as a true record of the meeting and decisions made. Cllr Studd seconded with all in favour.

6. Public Forum

Several residents reported that Footpath (FP) 32 is in a poor state of repair and, given its heavy use as a route to the Coop, fish and chip shop, school etc it be upgraded to reflect that. The resident has been in contact with Cllr Welham and enquiries have already been made by the Parish Council for works to be completed. Please see item 10 for further information.

One resident reported that their driveway is regularly being used by delivery drivers for turning, which is damaging the surface. Cllr Bridges advised that the Greens Committee will assess the damage.

A resident reported that the trunk of an ash tree on their property boundary moves in high winds. Cllr Bridges noted that this tree is part of ongoing tree maintenance around the village.

New footpaths at the back of Sycamore Close backing onto the green have become overgrown and narrow. The footpath is to be reported to SCC for clearing.

Road markings between Hornbeam Road and Maple Close have faded and there is a concern that there will be a traffic accident as a result. Highways to be asked about this junction.

A resident enquired about the site of the oak tree proposed to be planted in the cemetery. Cllr Bridges will enquire with the previous Chair. The same resident enquired about the progress of the tree planting on Chestnut Close, which the Clerk advised was ongoing.

The same resident enquired about the works to the bus shelter on Thorney Green Road, which the Clerk advised was ongoing via correspondence with Linden Homes.

There is a concern that the landscaping on Trinity Meadows has planted laurel, which was not permitted. This is a matter for MSDC, who are responsible for landscaping conditions.

Residents have reported that the footpath leading from Trinity meadows to Trinity walk has become overgrown and the surface degraded.

A resident reported that the Village Hall Trustees would like to hold refresher CPR & defibrillator training, which they would be happy to do with the Parish Council. Clerk to liaise with the Village Hall to arrange this.

7. To receive a report from the County Councillor Keith Welham

Members confirmed receipt of the County Council report. There were no questions.

Councillor Welham provided further updates on several issues:

Devolution – Cllr Welham reported that there had been no decision from the Government on Suffolk's fast track application as more time is needed to consider the request. 2025's elections are cancelled and Cllr Welham is happy to remain as County Councillor.

Cllr Welham enquired about the Crowfoot Close streetlight (Correspondence no. 3) and offered to pursue the County Council's adoption of streetlights in that area.

Regarding FP32, Cllr Welham recalled a meeting approximately 4 years ago between the County and Parish Councils to discuss widening, re-surfacing and reducing the slope at the southern end. Clerk to arrange a meeting with Josh White and Oliver Wastell from Highways, with Cllr Welham after ownership of land is clarified (please see item 10). Cllr Welham could fund design work from his locality budget.

Cllr Bridges asked Cllr Welham to amend the contents of his report, which stated that the Parish Council would fully fund the A1120 Crown junction upgrade works. The PC requested that Highways request £9,999 from MSDC (dec 2024 Minutes). As there was some discussion of the origins of the project, it was agreed to re-consider the project at the next meeting.

Cllr Welham clarified the contents of the letter from Freeman School's JRSOs (Correspondence no. 11), which should have readd Church Road rather than Green Road. He also confirmed that the SID cannot be located in the requested position but is to be installed further up the hill.

8. To receive a report from the District Councillors Rachel Eburne & Janet Pearson:

Members confirmed receipt of the District Council report. There were no questions. Cllr Pearson that there will be a Public Consultation for Suffolk's Devolution and asked if the PC had any questions. There were no questions.

9. Planning

Cllr Bridges has made enquiries with MSDC to see if the planning application for the houses that front onto FP32 included landscaping conditions for the path. Ownership needs to be determined. All Councillors were in favour of adopting improvements to FP32 as a project for 2025.

11. Cemetery & Churchyard

The gardener responsible for cemetery maintenance has requested a pay increase of £2, to 18.50ph from £16.50ph. Councillors accepted the increase, with Cllr Murton proposing, Cllr Easter seconding and all in favour.

13. Grass Cutting Tender

Councillors confirmed receipt of the tenders. Cllr Studd proposed that a recommendation is made that the Parish Council accepts the tender from TOP Garden Services, for 2025-2027. Cllr Melluish seconded and all were in favour.

14. Locality Budget

Cllr Pearson confirmed there was a small amount of Locality funding available for any projects the PC had in mind.

Councillors declined the funding on the basis there were no ongoing projects that needed it.

15. Clerk's Report

Councillors noted the report, with no questions.

16. Councillor's Reports

Cllr Murton reported that the footpaths on Trinity Meadows are degrading as the surface material is very fine. Cllr Murton also reported the dates for the next SOAP meetings: 9 April, 2 July, 24 Sept, 3 Dec.

Cllr Voden requested that the Emergency Planning section of the PC website be updated to reflect him as the responsible party.

Cllr Bridges reported that the cemetery tap is currently switched off at the meter until new part can be sourced and an isolation valve be fitted. There is also a dog waste bin with a rotten post (next to Trinity Meadows) that needs the post replacing and potentially moving further away from nearby houses.
